Responsibilities

Serve as the Missouri Board of Pharmacy PIC for the hospital.

- Responsible for establishing, maintaining, and enforcing hospital-wide medication services while ensuring compliance with state, federal, BNDD, DEA, and hospital laws, rules, regulations, and policies.
- Responsible for creating and enforcing hospital-wide medication policies and procedures.
- Responsible for maintenance of department certifications, licenses, and accreditation.

Supervise pharmaceutical contracting, formulary, drug inventory, distribution, and pricing.

- Monitor product usage and change to reduce cost, alleviate waste, and promote proper effective utilization of supplies and drugs.
- Responsible for loss prevention, quality control strategies, resource allocation, and ensuring accurate and cost-effective use of resources.
- Maintain VetView, Omnicell, BNDD/DEA, and pharmacy access systems, databases, and records.
- Maintain the physical needs of the VHC sterile IV hood, compounding powder hood, and Omnicell.

Serve as subject matter expert and provide pharmacy counseling services to clients, hospital veterinarians, technicians, students, and outside DVM medication question referrals.

- Audit controlled substance records and usage.
- Orient, train, lecture, and teach incoming staff, interns, residents, faculty, and students.

Responsible for interviewing, selecting, training, evaluating, and coaching pharmacy personnel.

- Manage the development, coordination, and maintenance of daily staffing schedules to ensure the appropriate level of coverage and continuity of care. Staffing may include staff pharmacists, pharmacy buyer, and pharmacy technicians.
- Monitor and oversee time and attendance in alignment with MU Veterinary Health Center policies and practices, ensuring accuracy of records and timely approval for payroll purposes.

Perform the duties of a pharmacist and complete other duties within the hospital, department, and college as needed.

Minimum Qualifications

- Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) or equivalent degree
- Pharmacist licensure by the Missouri Board of Pharmacy or ability to obtain licensure.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Completion of a veterinary pharmacy residency or three years of prior experience in a veterinary pharmacy is desirable but not required.
- Prior experience in both inpatient and outpatient pharmacy settings.
- Prior experience in supervisory or pharmacy management roles.
- Experience with pharmacy automation systems, preferably Omnicell.
